Responsibilities

<p>School principal</p>	<p>The principal as nominated supervisor, educational leader and responsible person holds primary responsibility for the preschool.</p> <p>The principal is responsible for ensuring:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the preschool is compliant with legislative standards related to this procedure at all times • all staff involved in the preschool are familiar with and implement this procedure • all procedures are current and reviewed as part of a continuous cycle of self-assessment. <p>These tasks may be delegated to other members of the preschool team, but the responsibility sits with the principal.</p>
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<p>Preschool supervisor</p>	<p>The preschool supervisor supports the principal in their role and is responsible for leading the review of this procedure through a process of self-assessment and critical reflection. This could include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • analysing complaints, incidents or issues and the implications for updates to this procedure • reflecting on how this procedure is informed by stakeholder feedback and relevant expert authorities • planning and discussing ways to engage with families and communities, including how changes are communicated • developing strategies to induct all staff when procedures are updated to ensure practice is embedded.
<p>Preschool teacher(s) and educator(s)</p>	<p>Preschool teachers and educators are responsible for working with the preschool leadership team to ensure:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • all staff in the preschool and daily practices comply with this procedure • this procedure is stored in a way that it is accessible to all staff, families, visitors and volunteers • they are actively involved in the review of this procedure, as required, or at least annually • details of this procedure's review are documented.

Procedure

<p>First aid qualifications</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All department staff (ongoing, temporary, and casual) complete the department's mandatory first aid training: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Australian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy (ASCIA) anaphylaxis e-training ○ anaphylaxis face-to-face training (mandatory if a child with anaphylaxis is enrolled in the preschool) ○ e-Emergency care ○ CPR face to face training (HLTAID001) • Cathie Bateup and Emma Vilarrubi both hold current HLTAID 012 First Aid Certificates • The names of the preschool educators who hold the NQF qualifications are clearly displayed in the preschool foyer. • Teachers' and educators' current certificates are stored in hard copy in the staffing qualification folder that is kept in the preschool's office. The preschool
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	<p>supervisor in collaboration with the SAO is responsible for maintaining this folder.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each teacher and educator take responsibility for ensuring their first aid qualifications remain current by monitoring the expiry date(s) and alerting the preschool supervisor or principal prior to requiring retraining. The preschool supervisor also reviews this folder once a term to ensure qualifications are maintained.
<p>First aid kit</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is a first aid kit(s) kept in both indoor classrooms and the emergency evacuation bag. This bag is taken outdoors by both SLSOs during all outdoor learning experiences. • The kits are inaccessible to children, but easily recognisable and accessible to adults. • A written record of the contents of the kit(s) is maintained, including the contents' expiry dates. It is the responsibility of our school's WHS Officer to maintain the first aid kit contents register (stored with all first aid kits) and restock the contents, if needed. • For use in an emergency, the first aid kit contains a general-use EpiPen Junior and asthma reliever medication (Ventolin) and instructions for their use. • The location of this emergency medication is clearly noted on the outside of the kit for the information of all staff, visitors, and volunteers. • When the group leaves the preschool to evacuate, for an excursion or to go into the school site, the following is taken in the emergency evacuation bag: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ list of children's emergency contacts ○ first aid kit ○ general – use emergency medications and instructions for use ○ individual children's emergency medication and medical management plans ○ the SLSO for both rooms is responsible for retrieving the emergency evacuation bag and individual children's emergency medication and medical management plans.
<p>Administration of first aid</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In any medical emergency an ambulance will be called immediately. The teacher on duty is responsible for phoning the ambulance. • In an anaphylaxis or asthma emergency, the preschool staff will administer emergency medication (EpiPen Jr or Ventolin) to a child who requires it. Parent/carer authorisation is not required for this. • If emergency medication is administered: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ an ambulance will be called ○ the principal and child's parent or carer will be notified

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ a notification will be made to Early Learning (phone 1300 083 698) within 24 hours. • If a child requires it, they will be administered first aid. • After first aid has been administered, the details will be recorded in an Incident, injury, trauma and illness record and stored in the child’s profile card that is kept in a secure filing cabinet in the school’s front office. Blank copies are available in the Preschool TEAMS channel, on a clipboard in the emergency bag, and next to the indoor first aid kits. • On collecting their child from preschool, the parent or carer will be notified of the circumstances surrounding the administration of first aid to their child and they will be asked to sign the completed <i>Incident, injury, trauma and illness record</i> as confirmation of this. • If the child then sees a medical practitioner in relation to their injury, a notification will be made to Early Learning (phone 1300 083 698) within 24 hours of the preschool staff becoming aware the child was taken for medical attention. If the child is not taken for medical attention, but a reasonable person would have thought they should have been, a notification must still be made. • If a child suffers a head or bite injury, their parent will be contacted as soon as practical.
